RED RIVER.

The following letter written by Mr. James Ross, we clip from the *Halton Journal*, Milton, C. W.

TORONTO, JULY, 16.

I leave this day for Red River Settlement, and wish to supplement my former statements with a few more sentences on sundry matters. I will be guided in the selection of items by the inquiries which I know are very prevalent at the present time.

I. We have no newspaper as yet in the Red River Settlement. None has ever been established or attempted to be established. It is said that the Hudson's Bay Company has always opposed the establishment of a paper there, and of course where their influence is all powerful their opposition must be effectual. If true, it indicates that publicity would be undesirable, and perhaps ruinous to them. A desire to conceal, is well fitted to excite suspicion, whether true or not. However, this I know, that the present representative of the Company in the Settlement is by no means opposed to the enterprise. Mr. McTavish is a gentleman of enlightened sentiments, and has little sympathy with his predecessors in the opinion, real or pretended, that "a newspaper would do more harm than good." Our population is about 8,500. One half is Roman Catholic, and has a much smaller per centage of readers than the Protestant half. After careful calculation I would set down the number of subscribers in the place at 600. There would be considerable number from Minnesota and not a few from Canada.—Perhaps some from England. And then there is all the job printing, advertisements &c. The Hudson's Bay Company have to get their official documents forms &c., printed England. That would fall into the hands of the publisher. The country is exciting a great deal of attention and will no doubt soon be very important. A paper started there has a very important and promising field. Will not some enterprising Canadian step in? Mr. Lawrie, of the *Owen Sound Times*, lately packed up press, types, and all and started for the Red River, but received some encouragement at Sault St. Marie's to publish there, which he is accordingly about to do.

2. We have not a single hotel or boarding house. You may think this strange; but so it is. Nor is it so strange when you take into account the fact that hitherto, the number of comers and goers has been very small. When I say 'hitherto'

I should explain it as comprising the period up to the last year or two. At the present moment there is a large number of visitors. In any case a hotel of some kind is required. There are several large and respectable houses that might be rented and furnished for the purpose.

3. A medical man or two we greatly need. In the whole settlement we have but two doctors, one of whom is connected with the company of Royal Canadian Rifles lately sent thither; the other is rather old and feeble for much active service, besides having his time taken up with other business.

4. Within the last year, a great deal of land has been taken up in and around the Red River colony. There has been quite a rush to the land office. This is one of the "signs of the times." People are looking ahead, and cannot fail to see progress and prosperity looming in the distance. The time has arrived when the Hudson Bay Territories must go forward in its career of improvement. The Hudson's Bay Company sell the lands. They do so in virtue of the rights given them by their charter. If the charter is worth anything it is worth a great deal—giving them not only the exclusive right to trade, but actual proprietorship in the soil. Land is sold at seven shillings and sixpence sterling per acre. Only a small installment is called for at once, however, the rest being paid very gradually.

Thus, Mr. Editor, I have briefly touched a few points more—points on which, I find, information is constantly demanded. I would be only too happy to furnish all requisite information regarding that part of the country, and in any way to help on the speedy settlement and improvement of my native country.

JEW OR CATHOLIC?—A case of considerable interest to the various religious denominations throughout the country is now pending before the Resident Judge of this district: It arises out of the following facts:—A young lady over fourteen years of age, the offspring of a marriage between a member of the Jewish faith and a Roman Catholic, is claimed by her mother, who wishes to bring her up according to the latter faith, against the will of the child, who has hitherto followed the former. We understand that the case has already occupied the attention of the New York Courts, where the claimants failed to obtain the redress which she is now seeking from our tribunals.—*Three Rivers Enquirer.*
