Scope and Content Note

The bulk of the accession consists of a variety of records that document the history of the Communist Party of Canada as found in original and copied pamphlets, articles, correspondence, theses and other related items. The records arrived with no discernable order, but there were pockets of related items and these were kept together wherever possible.

While conducting an inventory of the files, related items were identified. There were several pamphlets (most of them photocopied) produced by the Communisty Party of Canada, plus others produced by various labour and leftist organizations. Single pamphlets were placed in a separate series. Pamphlets excluded from this series are found in the relevant files throughout the papers. The file titles have been maintained as identified by Professor Penner.

The accession has been organized into seven series. Series I consists of correspondence. Series II reflects an allencompassing history of the Communist Party of Canada as seen through correspondence, party files, writings of famous communists, press clippings, minutes, speeches, and private notes. Sub-series include congresses, national conventions, meetings, notable leftist figures, and any political party, league or union where communist involvement is documented Series III consists of social issues. The communist trials of 1931, and the documentation on internment during the second world war are included in this series.

Series IV consists of general printed material. The files are organized alphabetically, then chronologically within each file. The printed material in series V is identified by the author and filed alphabetically by the author's surname.

Series VI, Sources and Selected Materials, includes invoices and indices from the various archives where Norman Penner conducted research. Series VII, Miscellaneous, consists of one file. It contains invoices, correspondence and communist documentation. There is one hard covered book entitled **A fan's notes**, by Frederick Exley.

Immediate Source of Acquisition Archives and Special Collections received four boxes from Prof. Penner's office in 1989.
